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
1. Mission Statement

5. Equipment

For many individuals living with Muscular Dystrophy (MD) and their support networks, the need for specialized disability equipment is paramount. These essential devices are often prohibitively expensive, creating a significant barrier to improved quality of life and independence.

The Muscular Dystrophy Foundation of South Africa (MDFSA), Gauteng Branch, is committed to alleviating this burden by loaning necessary equipment to our members. This arrangement is a lifetime loan; the equipment remains the property of the Branch and is returned once it is no longer needed, ensuring it can assist other members in need.

Our Equipment Committee meticulously handles all applications, striving to prioritize the most urgent and critical needs within the constraints of our limited funds. We aim to support those members who need it the most, providing items such as motorized wheelchairs, bath lifts etc.

The needs of individuals with MD are specific and vary greatly depending on the type and progression of their condition. For many, maintaining independence is a crucial goal, and when mobility becomes challenging, devices like motorized wheelchairs and mobility scooters become indispensable.

Application Process for Equipment Assistance

- Application Submission: Members in need must complete and submit an application form, accurately detailing their requirements. Supporting documents are as follows:
 - Identification document
 - Financial statements for 3 months
 - Assessment by a physiotherapist or medical professional to ensure the equipment meets the member's unique needs.

Should the application be approved, an agreement for the use of the equipment must be signed by the member and a Branch representative.

Additionally, MDFSA provides education on the proper use and maintenance of the equipment, offering regular servicing support.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all our donors for their continuous support. Your contributions are vital in enabling us to meet the urgent needs of our members and enhance their quality of life.
